

## Locate OSINT Updates – May 2021

### Enhancing Images

We have added a section called **Enhancing Images** on the Photo Related Sites page to the website at <https://www.uk-osint.net/photosites.html>. There are links to a number of free online resources, some of which need you to sign in with a Google or Facebook account, which allow you to upload and enhance an image.

So adding an image to <https://www.myheritage.com/photo-enhancer> is really quite effective at cleaning up an old image and making it a lot clearer, which might help in identifying people in old scanned in images.

Others sites are at <https://deep-image.ai/>, <https://photoshop.adobe.com/adjust>, <https://www.fotor.com/photo-editor-app/editor/basic> and <https://letsenhance.io/>, with some of these offering additional image enhancement functions and some being better than others but the MyHeritage site was surprisingly good.

### Skylens – Geolocation Search Site

We have added a link to Skylens, <https://app.skylens.io/> to the Photo Related Sites page on our website at <https://www.uk-osint.net/photosites.html>.

Skylens at <https://app.skylens.io/> is a free online resource which lets you search via an area and a date range for any uploaded posts to sites including Flickr, Twitter, VK, YouTube and Weibo.

### Two New Search Resources

We have added two new search resources to the Other Popular Search Engines & Sites section on the Search Engines page to our website at <https://www.uk-osint.net/searchengines.html>.

**SeQe** at <https://seqe.me/> is a useful tool for constructing search queries using advanced search operators simultaneously for five search engines, including Google, Bing, Yahoo, Baidu & DuckDuckGo.

**MillionShort** at <https://millionshort.com/> is a search site which removes the top search engine results, which may be helpful in locating older, less popular information.

### **Lumen Database**

The Lumen Database at <https://www.lumendatabase.org/> is an online database of takedown notifications for online sites. So using a combination of searches on Lumen, then searches and checks on archive sites such as at <https://archive.org/> and <https://archive.today> may allow you to find information that has been taken down.
