

Locate OSINT Updates – September 2020

It's Neil here with September's OSINT Updates, to let you know of any changes in the world of OSINT. In this update we are going to let you know about;

Google Account ID Numbers

Last month we covered how you could identify the Google Account ID Number linked to someone's Google Account from a shared Google Drive Document or a Gmail Email Address.

This was a slightly long winded manual method but thankfully some very clever people have created a free online resource to locate the Google Account ID Number linked to a Gmail Email Address.

Epieos at <https://tools.epieos.com/google-account.php> allows you to input a known Gmail Email Address and will then display the linked Google Account ID Number along with the URL's for the linked Photo Album & Reviews & Map, as well as details of any linked YouTube accounts and sometimes other linked accounts / apps, such as News360.

Obviously not every Google account is linked to public content but this is a quick, easy and importantly free way of looking for content linked to a Gmail Email Address.

UK Electoral Roll Site

LeakPeek (<https://leakpeek.com>) is more commonly known as a site where you can check your email address to see if it and your password have been sold online after being accessed by one of the numerous known data breaches, however LeakPeek also allows you to search the UK electoral roll data, with a cheap daily account and no licencing costs or restrictions.

So for only £1.70 you can have unlimited 24 hour access to not only the extended LeakPeek hacked Email & Domain data but also to their UK Electoral Roll data search site, so you can search for an individual to see their electoral roll entry.

Sometimes a name may return too many results, so it may be useful if you can narrow your search. A result will include details of a home address, other linked family members at the address and some other details, such as any listed year of birth for the person, any listed landline telephone numbers and the last known value paid for the property.

Mapping / Streetview Sites

Sites like Mapillary (<https://www.mapillary.com/app/>) & OpenStreetCam (<https://openstreetcam.org/map>) show crowdsourced video / images from people's dashboard cameras, searchable by a map of the world.

So if you are interested in researching an area but for some reason it is not shown on either Google's Streetview or Bings Streetside, or may be that what is show is out of data on those sites, then you can use Mapillary & OpenStreetCam to view recent images of an area.

Send to Internet Archive

This add-on / extension adds a button to your toolbar, which when clicked, saves the webpage which you are currently viewing to the Internet Archive (<https://archive.org>), for use as a trusted citation in the future.

It does so by opening a new tab, to keep your focus on the current tab so it doesn't distract. You can also right-click on a link to save it to the Internet archive directly.

There is another similar add-on / extension for Firefox & Chrome called Archive Page, which is available at <https://addons.mozilla.org/en-US/firefox/addon/archive-page/> & <https://chrome.google.com/webstore/detail/archive-page/gcaimhkfmliahedmeklebabdgagipbia> which adds a button to your toolbar, which when clicked, it sends the URL of the current tab to <https://archive.today/> to preserve a snapshot of the page and opens the result in a new tab.
